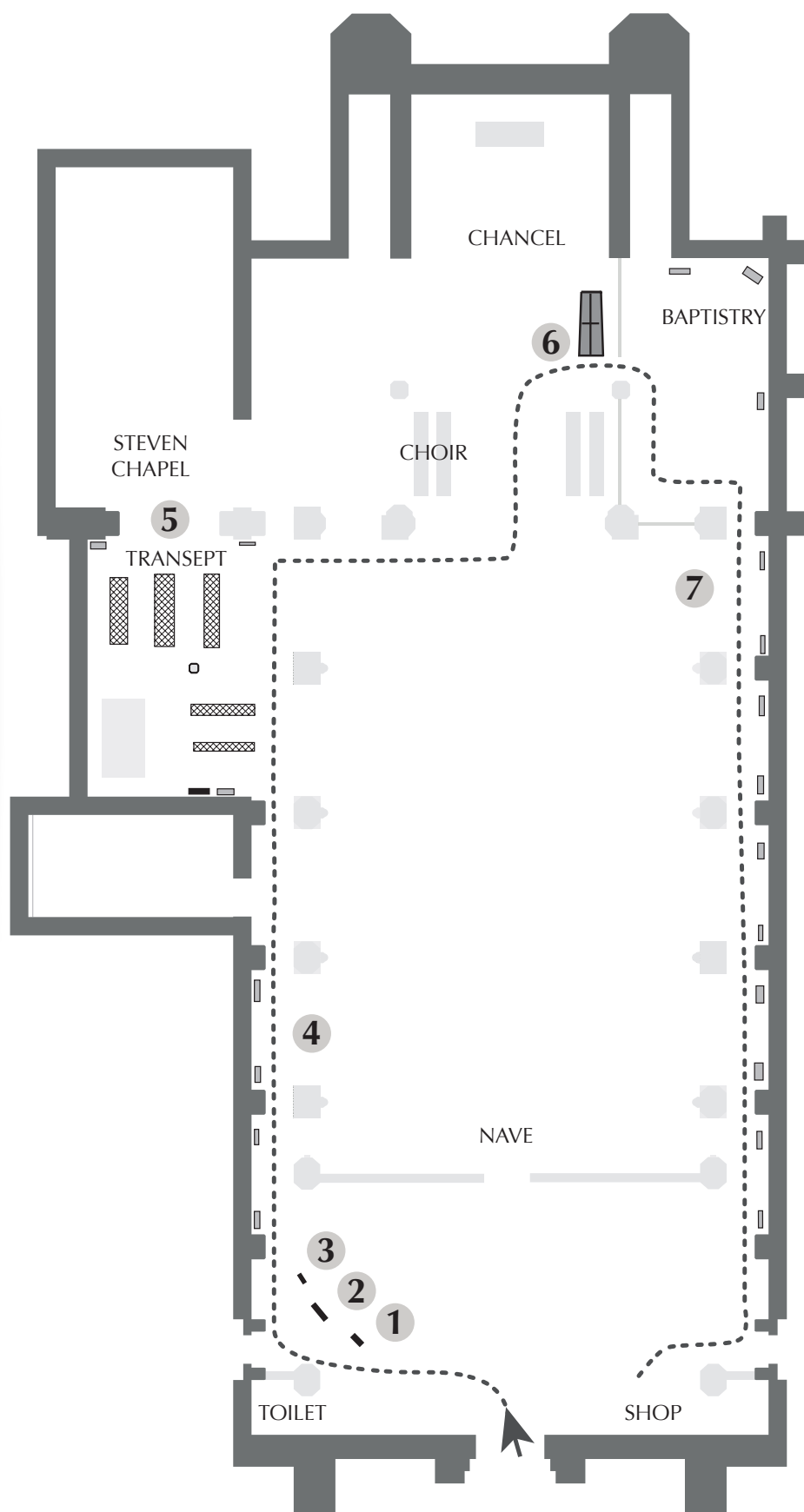






Welcome to Govan Old Parish Church

There has been a church on this site for many centuries: it is believed that the first church here may have been built as long ago as the 5th or 6th century.

Govan was once a part of the kingdom of Strathclyde. The rulers of the kingdom (and perhaps even the kings themselves) were buried here, with splendid gravestones to mark their graves.
